Our Faculty: The nationalities of the teaching staff at Yangon Academy are predominately from The United States and Myanmar. A high percentage of the secondary faculty hold advanced degrees with current certification, and an equally significant percentage of the Myanmar teachers also hold master's degrees. Overall, our core secondary teachers average 15+ years of experience, with considerable prior teaching experience in various international schools.

Our Academic Program: Students follow an American-based curriculum, with associated standards. Students must earn 27 credits to graduate. Classes are scheduled for 65-minutes per class within a five-period day on a two-day rotation cycle. Specialist classes are offered in Art, Music, Computer Studies, and Physical Education. Myanmar Language and Culture classes are also required for all students through Grade 12. Most students in the upper secondary take two or three college-level AP courses.


Exam Center: Yangon Academy is a College Board-approved testing site for both S.A.T and AP examinations.
